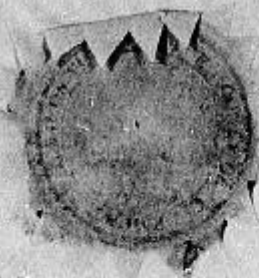

The State of Ohio  
Blount County      5  
On the 8<sup>th</sup> day of June 1820  
I personally appeared in open  
court (being the Court of Common Pleas within  
and for said county, and also being a Court of  
record, which has the power of fine and  
imprisonment. Archibald Lindsay aged 73  
Years, resident in the said county, who first  
being duly sworn, according to law, doth on his  
oath declare, that he served in the revolutionary  
War, as follows, to wit in the 9<sup>th</sup> Reg<sup>t</sup> Commanded  
by Col. John Gibson in the Company, Commanded  
by Capt. John Springer in the Virginia line,  
and that he was notified of his being inseri-  
-ed on the pension list roll of the Ohio Agency  
at eight dollars per month commencing on the 5<sup>th</sup>  
day of June 1818. by a pension Certificate  
No. 11613. bearing date 7<sup>th</sup> June 1819. & I do  
solemnly swear, that I was a resident citizen  
of the United States, on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of March  
1818. & that I have not since, that time, by  
gift sale or in any manner, disposed of my  
property or any part thereof, with intent thereby  
to diminish it, as to bring myself, within  
the provisions of an act of Congress, entitled  
"An act to provide for certain persons engaged  
in the land and naval service of the United  
States in the revolutionary War." passed on the  
18<sup>th</sup> day of March 1818. & that I have not nor  
had any person in trust for me any Property  
or security, contracts or debts, now due to me

nor have I any income other than what is  
containe<sup>d</sup> in the schedule herunto annexed  
and by me subscribed, to wit, real estate  
none (one cow, five bee hives, and he is a  
daily labourer, but owing to age and infirmity  
is unable to work but a small part of the  
time, & that he has no family, but himself  
sworn to and declared }  
on the 8<sup>th</sup> day of June } <sup>this</sup> Wright + Gudgey  
1820. before the said court } mark

Madam:

I have to advise you that from the papers in the Revolutionary War pension claim S. 41770 it appears that Heseekiah Lindsey enlisted, date not stated, in Westmoreland County, Pennsylvania and served three years as a private in Captain Uriah Springer's Company, Colonel John Gibson's Virginia Regiment.

He was allowed pension on his application executed June 5, 1818 while a resident of Clermont County, Ohio aged seventy-one years.

It is not stated whether he was ever married.
