THE SCOTCH

"THE POVERTY OF SCOTLAND, THE WARS WAGED UPON HER BY ENGLAND, RELIGIOUS PERSECUTION, AND THE INTERNAL DISSENSIONS SENT MANY OF HER SONS AND DAUGHTERS THRUOUT THE WORLD. AMOST EVERY COUNTRY HAS BEEN ENRICHED BY AN INFUSION OF BLOOD FROM THE STURDY PEOPLE OF THIS LITTLE LAND---NO COUNTRY IS MORE INDEBTED TO HER THAN THE UNITED STATES.--

THE SCOTCH WERE THRIFTY, HARD WORKING, GOD FEARING, AND WERE USED TO DANGER AND PRIVATION. THEY BELIEVED IN EDUCATION AND CARRIED THE BIBLE AS THEIR BEST-BELOVED BOOK. THEY WERE IDEAL COLONISTS FOR A NEW AND WILD COUNTRY.--THEY TROOPED TO AMERICA, BUT MANY WENT FIRST TO NORTH OF IRELAND THUS WERE CALLED SCOTCH-IRISH.--THEY PUT IRON IN THE BLOOD OF AMERICA AND HELPED MAKE THIS A GOD-FEARING NATION."

EARLY HISTORY OF SOUTHWESTERN PENNSYLVANIA

VIRGINIA IN 1744 PURCHASED FROM THE IROQUOIS A TRACT OF LAND WITH WESTERN BOUNDARY LIMITS-"THE SETTING SUN". THE OHIO COMPANY WAS ORGANIZED IN 1748 WITH THE PURPOSE OF SETTLING ENGLISH COLONISTS IN THE OHIO VALLEY AND TO TRADE WITH THE RED MAN.

1753 FAMILIES SETTLED AT FT. BRADDOCK-NOW IN FAYETTE Co.

1754 FORT STARTED AT FORKS OF OHIO; THE FRENCH TOOK IT AND NAMED IT FT. DUQUESNE-THEY HELD IT UNTIL

1758 WHEN ENGLISH CAPTURED IT-CALLED IT FT. PITT

1759 FT. PITT BECAME THE FOUNDATION OF COMMERCIAL LIFE
BRADDOCK CAME FROM THE SOUTH
FORBES CAME FROM THE EAST OVER THE ALLEGHENIES
FT. BEDFORD

1760 FT. PITT HAD 200 FAMILIES

1763 AN INFLOW OF TRADERS CAME IN AFTER THE BATTLE OF BUSHY RUN, WHEN CO. BOQUET DEFEATED THE INDIANS

1780 WHEN MASON DIXON LINE WAS EXTENDED AND BOUNDARY SETTLED. THEN PA. ORGANIZED 5 BATTALIONS OF MILITIA.

AFTER THE REVOLUTION VA. RETREATED FROM ITS BELLICOSE POSITION.

HISTORICAL DATA

FRONTIER FORTS OF PA. v.2 p.131,231

"FT. MCINTOSH ON RIGHT BANK OF OHIO & BEAVER 10/8/1778 HEADQUARTERS OF ARMY REMOVED FROM FT. PITT TO NEW FORT, WHERE LARGEST BODY OF TROOPS COLLECTED WEST OF ALLEGHENY WAS COLLECTED DURING THE REVOLUTION. THEY CONSISTED OF CONTINENTAL TROOPS AND MILITIA, MOSTLY FROM W. COUNTIES OF VA. 11/5/1778 THEY STARTED FOR DETROIT; AFTER 70 MILES FT. LAURENS WAS BUILT. 150 MEN WERE LEFT THERE UNDER COL. JOHN GIBSON;--PART OF 13. TH CL. IN THE WINTER OF 1778 THE 8TH PA WAS AT FT. PITT. CONDITIONS WERE VERY POOR FOR THE SOLDIERS--LACKED MEAT, TENTS, CLOTHES, AND PAY. THE 8TH PA. WAS RAISED IN WESTMORELAND, CO., PA."

"WEST AUGUSTA REGT.--THE 13TH CL RAISED IN CO. OF WEST-MORELAND OR AS VA. CALLED IT AUGUSTA CO., VA. BY COL. CRAWFORD; EXPECTED TO BE GUARD FOR SETTLERS AGAINST INDIANS. BY EARLY PART OF 1777 YOUGHIOHENY & MONONGAHELA AREA HAD FURNISHED TWO REGIMENTS TO QUOTA OF VA., BESIDES EIGHT FULL COMPANIES TO PA.

THE 13TH CL VA. PERFORMED ITS SERVICE IN THE WEST, BEING STATIONED IN DETACHMENTS AT FT. PITT, FT. MCINTOSH, AND OTHER POINTS ON THE OHIO AND ALLEGHENY RIVERS".

AT THE MOUTH OF THE KANAWHA, WHICH IS IN SIGHT OF GALLIOPOLIS, THERE WAS A SMALL TOWN CALLED PT. PLEASANT. DURING INDIAN WARS, A GUARRISON WAS KEPT HERE WITH GUARD OF SOLDIERS IN CHARGE OF VA. ON 9/10/1774 A BLOODY BATTLE WAS FOUGHT ON WATERS OF OHIO--DUNMORE'S WAR--BETWEEN VA. TROOPS UNDER GEN. ANDREW LEWIS AND INDIANS UNDER CORNSTALK.

"WHEN PA. PASSED ACT OF GRADUAL ABOLITION OF SLAVERY, VA. CONCEDED DISPUTED TERRITORY TO HER IN 1780. MANY VA. & MD. SETTLERS BECAME DISSATISFIED AND EMIGRATED TO KENTUCKY."

HISTORICAL DATA

"A SHORT HISTORY OF THE UNITED STATES"-BASSETT 1920 p.203

"BEFORE THE REVOLUTION BEGAN HARDY SETTLERS HAD CROSSED THE ALLEGHENIES FROM BOTH VIRGINIA AND NORTH CAROLINA. THE INDIANS SAW THEIR ADVENT WITH ALARM, AND IN 1774 THE SETTLEMENTS OF KENTUCKY WERE RAVAGED. GOV. DUNMORE OF VA. MARCHED AGAINST THEM AND FORCED THEM TO MAKE PEACE; AFTER A SHARP DEFEAT, THE INDIANS RELINQUISHING THEIR CLAIMS TO KENTUCKY. THIS OUTBREAK WAS KNOWN AS 'LORD DUNMORE'S WAR'."

"THE BATTLE OF POINT PLEASANT MADE THE SETTLEMENT OF KENTUCKY POSSIBLE--LORD DUNMORE DIRECTED GEN. ANDREW LEWIS TO RAISE TROOPS---PICKED MEN FROM THE BEST ARMED SECTION OF VA.---CHOICEST TROOPS WERE FROM AUGUSTA Co.-600 TROOPS, PERHAPS 400 MEN; BOTECOURT Co.-450 TROOPS, 350 MEN; FINCASTLE COL (FORMED 1772-S.W. VA. & KY.); BEDFORD Co.; SETTLEMENT OF HOLSTEIN---TO MEET HIM AT PT. PLEASANT.--NOT ONLY WERE THESE THE BEST ARMED MEN IN THE STATE BUT THEIR TRAINING FROM CHILDHOOD HAD BEEN A NEVER ENDING WARFARE WITH THE INDIANS.--THE FLOWER OF THE PRESBYTERIANS (SCOTCH SETTLERS OF ULSTER, ETC.) FOLLOWED THE ARISTOCRACY OF CATHOLIC IRELAND INTO EXILE. THE EASTERN DISTRICTS WERE PEOPLED; THESE SCOTCH-IRISH BOLDLY PUSHED PAST SETTLED REGIONS AND PLUNGED INTO THE WILDERNESS AS LEADERS OF THE WHITE ADVANCE, THE FIRST AND LAST SET OF IMMIGRANTS TO DO THIS (ROOSEVELT)"

LORD DUNMORE HAS BEEN ACCUSED OF TREACHERY--THAT HE DID NOT MEET LEWIS (MEN AS SCHEDULED AND SENT INDIANS EQUIPPED BY THE ENGLISH TO ATTACK THEM. (THEY WERE DISCOVERED AND THE BATTLE WON). AS HE HAD PLANNED, ACCORDING TO SOME, THE STRONGEST MEN WOULD HAVE BEEN EXTERMINATED. OTHERS CLAIM NO TREACHERY HAS BEEN PROVED."

"THERE WERE TWO LIST OF SOLDIERS WHO WERE PAID OFF AT AT PITTSBURG AND ROMNEY IN 1775. APPARENTLY THESE MEN WERE COLONIAL RATHER THAN REVOLUTIONARY--WHO WERE IN DUNMORE'S WAR AND WERE LATE RECEIVING THEIR PAY--ALMOST TO A MAN THEY TRANSFERRED OVER INTO REVOLUTIONARY SERVICE"
